

Discover the East Bay Regional Parks

Founded in 1934, the East Bay Regional Park District preserves and protects nearly 125,000 acres of beautiful open space in Alameda and Contra Costa counties. The Park District's 73 Regional Parks include critical wildlife habitats, shorelines, lakes, creeks, ranchlands and historic sites.

The Park District works to ensure a healthy and thriving ecosystem that protects wildlife and habitat, and adapts to the changing climate by restoring wetlands, repairing levees, thinning trees, monitoring algae blooms, and building park facilities and trails above future 2080 sea levels. Additionally, these parklands remove carbon dioxide from the air, equivalent to the emissions of 60,000 vehicles annually.

There are over 1,250 miles of trails for hiking, biking and horseback riding, as well as picnic areas, campgrounds, swim facilities and golf courses. As a leader of the Healthy Parks Healthy People movement, the Park District invites you to experience physical, mental and social health benefits by spending time in nature.




